(part of speech, morphology)
ergō quid habeō? Therefore what do I have?
(syntactic function)
ergō quid exspectō? Therefore what do I expect?
(morpho-syntactic expectations)

How to use this card to learn to read in word order:

Only expose one word at a time in the window at the top left, keeping the rest of the sentence covered. As you read each word, consider the above questions. Beginners can use this basic placeholding sentence to paraphrase as each new word is met:

Someone/something verbed someone/something (to someone).

NOMINATIVE VERB ACCUSATIVE DATIVE

mercātor – The merchant verbed something to someone.
mercātor fēminae – The merchant verbed something to the woman.
mercātor fēminae stolās – The merchant verbed dresses to the woman.
mercātor fēminae stolās ostendit. – The merchant showed dresses to the woman.

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
